Continuing Education Units

“Continuing education units” (C.E.U.) means units of academic study from an accredited institution of higher education or from a training and development program approved by the Council for the Continuing Education...” (Chapter 115) Continuing Education Units are awarded after the successful completion of a professional development activity or graduate course work. CEUs may be used for *re-certification only*, not initial certification.

Additionally, some school districts allow teachers to use earned CEUs for movement on the salary scale.

One CEU is the equivalent of 10 contact hours of professional development activity.

Scholarships

The Maine Association of School Libraries (MASL) offers several scholarships for professional growth

Walter J. Taranko School Library Media Scholarships

A maximum of five scholarships up to \$1,000 are available to MASL members with a professional degree or who are pursuing study in the library/media field for a professional degree. The guidelines are:

1. The applicant must have been a member of MASL for one year
2. The applicant must be enrolled in a library science/educational media course / program, OR seeking 071 certification in the state of Maine OR seeking professional development.
3. Payment of scholarships awarded will be made upon evidence of successful completion of the course, workshop or conference. For a course, payment of scholarships awarded will be limited to tuition and required resources, up to \$1000. Official certified documentation of grade transcripts and expense receipts must be sent to the Scholarship Chair or directly to the MASL Treasurer.
For a conference, payment of scholarships awarded will be limited to registration, accommodations, transportation, and meals served as part of the conference. Receipts for each expense must be submitted to the Scholarship Chair or directly to the MASL Treasurer. Receipts must be accompanied by an assessment of the course or conference, to be no more than one page long and including new learning and how it will be applied in your employment position. For a conference, please list workshops attended. Other educational events will be adjudicated by the scholarship committee.
4. The applicant must be a Maine resident or enrolled in a Maine based program, or employed in a Maine institution.
5. Applications must be received at least one month prior to the beginning of the course or conference.

Audrey Conant Scholarship

Asgard Foundation began this scholarship but it is now managed by MASL.

MASL School Library Ed Tech Scholarship

A maximum of five scholarships of up to \$500 are available to MASL members pursuing study in the library/media field for an associate or bachelor's degree. The guidelines are:

1. The applicant must have been a member of MASL for one year .

2. The applicant must be enrolled in an associate's or bachelor's degree library science/educational media program, or library technology program, or seeking ed. Tech. endorsement, or professional development.

3. Payment of scholarships awarded will be made upon evidence of successful completion of the course, workshop or conference. For a course, payment of scholarship awarded will be limited to tuition and required resources, up to a total of \$500. Official certified documentation of grade transcripts and expenses must be sent to the Scholarship Chair or directly to the MASL Treasurer. For a conference, payment of scholarships awarded will be limited to registration, accommodations, transportation, and meals served as part of the conference. Receipts for each expense must be submitted to the Scholarship Chair or directly to the MASL Treasurer.

Receipts must be accompanied by an assessment of the course or conference, to be no more than one page long and including new learning and how it will be applied in your employment position. For a conference, please list workshops attended. Other educational events will be adjudicated by the scholarship committee.

3. The applicant must be a Maine resident or enrolled in a Maine based program, or employed in a Maine institution

4. Applications must be received at least one month prior to the beginning of the course or conference.

Scholarship awards will be made at the Fall Maine Libraries Conference. Payment of scholarships awarded will be made upon evidence of successful completion of the first semester or course. A copy of grade transcripts must be sent to the Scholarship Chair or directly to the MASL Treasurer.

Maine Legislative Memorial Scholarship Fund

Sixteen \$1,000 awards (one per county) are made annually to students going to a two- or four-year degree granting Maine school. Scholarships are available to graduating high school seniors or full/part-time post-secondary students accepted or enrolled in a Maine college. Graduate students are also eligible. Awards are based on academic excellence, school and community contributions, financial need, letters of recommendation, and a required essay.

Maine State Chamber of Commerce Scholarship

One \$1,500 scholarship is given to an adult learner planning to pursue an education at a two-year degree granting college. Preference may be to a student attending a Maine college and seeking a degree in a business- or education-related field. Awards are based on an adult being 23 years or older and having legal dependents other than a spouse.

The Maine Community Foundation is one of the largest sources of scholarship support in the State of Maine with over 200 funds that benefit Maine residents.

Rodney C. Harmon Memorial Scholarship

Who is eligible to apply? Any Maine resident who is currently enrolled, or will enroll, full-time in an accredited postsecondary educational institution and is pursuing an associates or higher degree is eligible to apply.

National Board for Professional Teaching Standards

The National Board for Professional Teaching Standards (NBPTS) is an independent, nonprofit, nonpartisan and nongovernmental organization. It was formed in 1987 to advance the quality of teaching and learning by developing professional standards for accomplished teaching, creating a voluntary system to certify teachers who meet those standards and integrating certified teachers into educational reform efforts. Teacher must have taught in their current subject matter for a minimum of three years.

The process of becoming Nationally Board certified is rigorous and research-based. Similar to board-certified doctors and accountants, teachers who achieve National Board Certification have met high professional standards through intensive study, expert evaluation, self-assessment and peer review. NBPTS offers 25 certificates that cover a variety of subject areas and student developmental levels. National Board Certificates are valid for a period of five (5) years and are renewable.

The State of Maine provides a \$2750 yearly stipend for Nationally Certified Teachers for the life of the certificate, as long as the teacher is employed as a classroom teacher in the field of certification. That’s \$13,750 over the course of the certificate! In addition, some school districts in the state provide additional compensation and reimbursement for costs incurred in achieving National Board Certification. Not only can Library Media staff provide professional resources for teachers seeking National Board Certification, they may also seek National Board Certification themselves!

A Portfolio of four entries must be prepared and presented. A written assessment test must be passed in order to achieve National Board Certification. Candidates may take up to three years to certify. “Take One” (the presentation of one video portfolio) as an opportunity for anyone who want to try the process before committing to pursuing National Board Certification. The time commitment for Take One is 40-50 hours and may be completed in a year and a half. For more information on Take One visit http://nbpts.org/products_and_services/take_one1.
